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## CITY ASSIGNS GOLF COURSE PROPERTY TASK FORCE

New group will further future use of property

Westminster, MD —Although the property has not yet been transferred to the City, the Mayor and Common Council have appointed a Wakefield Valley Golf Course Task Force for the longer term planning for the use of the property. This Task Force will solicit Requests for Proposals from a number of organizations. It will be chaired by Ed Cramer, a long-time resident of Long Valley and current Chairman of the Board of Zoning Appeals for the City of Westminster. In the meantime, the City will maintain the walking trails and ponds and allow the public to use these trails. The City will continue to maintain the 25 foot perimeter adjacent to the properties directly joining the golf course and will maintain a four foot wide strip on either side of the trails. The bridges will be repaired to provide a continuous path. This work will be completed by mid-June and the property will be open to the public. The buildings will remain fenced and unavailable to the public.
